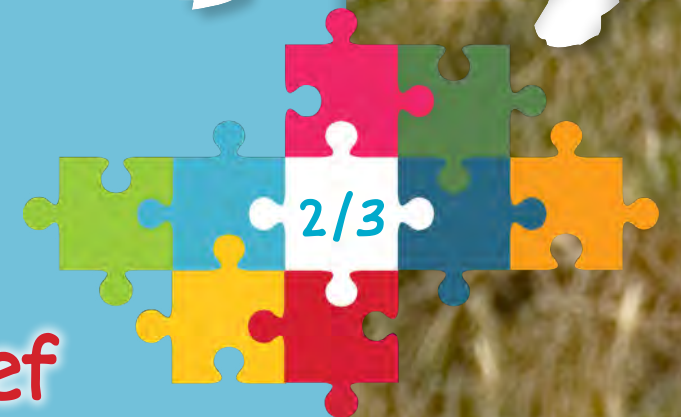
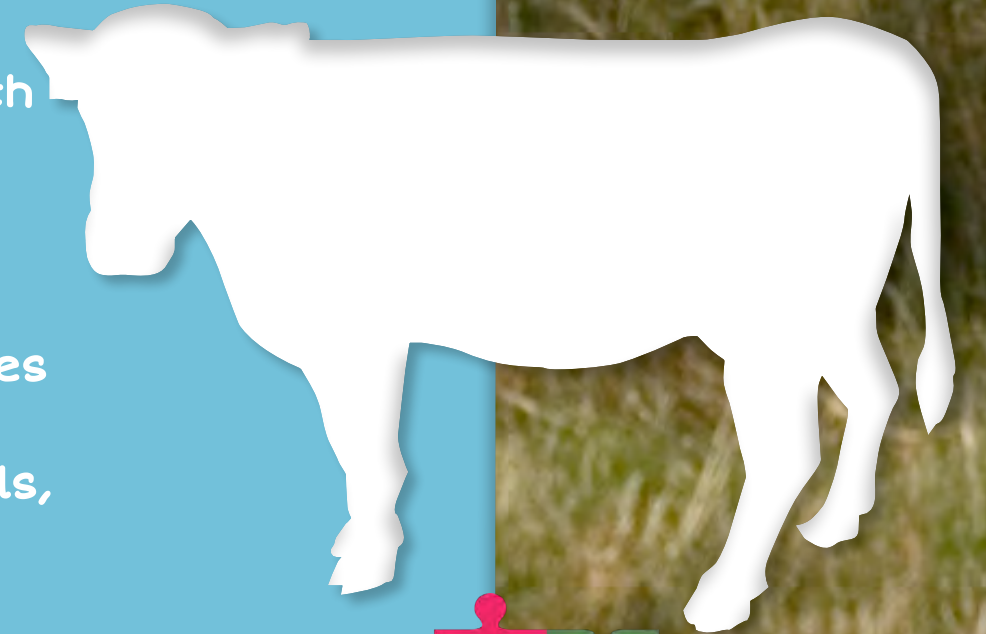
Alberta's landscapes influence the variety of goods and services provided by agriculture.

Cattle can use their tails to swat away flies.



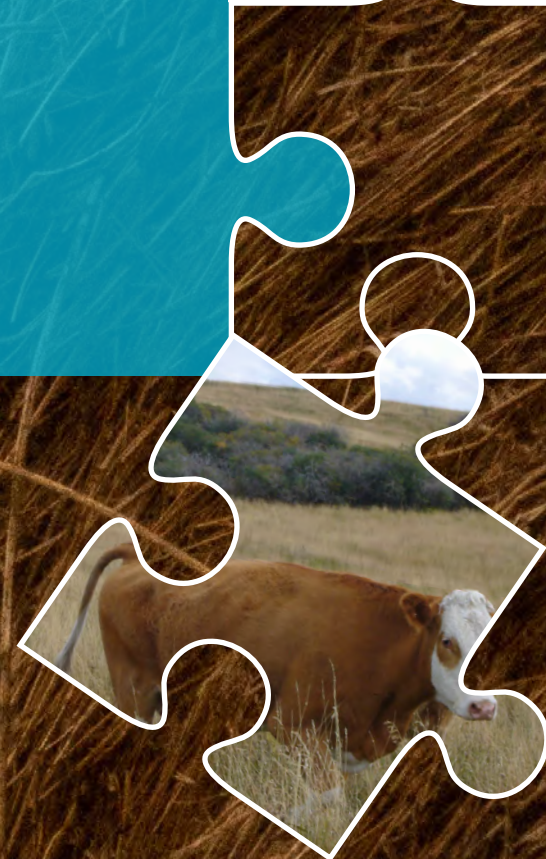
Cattle have heavy coats that help them stay warm in the winter months.
